Dear Parent / Carer,

PE kit for September 2010

I thought I would take this opportunity to remind you about our kit expectations in PE lessons.

In previous years, our timetable has been split into 'PE' (indoor) and 'Games' (outdoor) lessons. Since the introduction of our new timetable, in line with Government strategies, all activities are referred to as 'PE'. Traditionally, the students in Key Stage 3 wear the white polo shirt, blue shorts and white socks for 'PE' lessons, and rugby tops, blue shorts and blue socks for 'Games' lessons.

For September, the new year 7 kit has changed to:

GIRLS	BOYS
Barclay royal blue PE polo shirt (indoor & outdoor)	Barclay school royal blue PE polo shirt (indoor)
Barclay school royal blue PE sweatshirt (outdoor)	Barclay school Rugby top (outdoor)
Royal blue shorts (indoor and outdoor)	Royal blue shorts (indoor and outdoor)
Royal blue long socks (indoor and outdoor)	Royal blue long socks (indoor and outdoor)

In years 8 and 9, students will wear what they have done this year (apart from their socks):

BOYS and GIRLS
Barclay PE polo shirt (indoor)
Barclay school Rugby top (outdoor)
Royal blue shorts (indoor and outdoor)
Royal blue long socks (indoor and outdoor)

NB: We would like students to wear their blue socks for indoor and outdoor lessons (not white socks indoor). This is due to the fact that we have an array of sock colours and styles being worn when the blue socks aren't being worn, and a number of students are not changing out of their school socks for PE lessons. Also, if your son / daughter needs to buy any new kit it will be as the new year 7 kit above.

In year 10 and 11, students are required to wear:

- Current white polo t-shirt / new royal blue polo T-shirt (being introduced for new year 7 students in September), polo shirt with name on the back; or
- Current games top;
- Current royal blue shorts; or
- Navy, black or grey tracksuit / jogging bottoms.

In every year, all students must wear **TRAINERS**. Too many students have been wearing plimsolls recently and this creates health and safety issues. Students will also need shin-pads during the course of the year depending on when they do football / hockey and football boots for football.
